

Articulation Agreement Process for Domestic and International Partnerships

Articulation agreements are an important vehicle for developing academic pathways for transfer students, and an opportunity to build relationships with partner academic institutions. The steps below ensure collaboration with key stakeholders, leading to more comprehensive and effective agreements.

Steps to establishing articulations:

- Verify accreditation and or recognition of potential partner institutions by contacting UNI Office of Admissions and consulting with appropriate leadership team members - Paul Sapp (domestic articulations) or Kristi Marchesani (international articulations)
- 2) Request appropriate curriculum information (i.e. plan of study, major requirements, course descriptions, syllabi) from partner school for any proposed major linkages. Submit materials to the Office of Admissions for review of General Education courses in consultation with the Office of Undergraduate Studies and other appropriate academic departments as necessary.
- 3) Check curricula of partner institution for alignment with major program requirements
- 4) Enter General Education and major course credit evaluation into the UNI Curriculum Worksheets
 - Appendix A General Education Worksheet
 - Appendix B Academic Program Worksheet
 - Appendix C Articulation Credit Summary
- 5) Meet with representatives from the academic department(s), Office of Admissions (or International Admissions for foreign institutions) and Office of Undergraduate Studies to review articulation.
- 6) Finalize UNI Curriculum Worksheets (Appendix A, B and C)
- 7) Submit completed Curriculum Worksheets to the Office of Admissions, who will then initiate the Articulation Agreement DocuSign signature process with UNI and partner institution administrators listed on the Agreement.
- 8) The Office of Admissions will provide copies of agreement to the:
 - Provost's Office
 - Office of the Registrar
- 9) The Office of Admissions staff will create a Transfer Plan of Study based on the final articulation agreement and post to the Office of Admissions website.

Appendix B - Academic Program Worksheet

EOUIVALENCY 1:

The academic program worksheet lists the required courses for the select major at UNI – and identifies which of those courses are satisfied by coursework from the partner institution. The UNI courses may be satisfied by a course-to-course equivalency – or by a combination of courses from the partner institution. For example, in the example articulation on the following page, UNI GEOG 4260 is satisfied by three courses from Kirkwood, AGN 105, AGN 240, & AGN 248. For international articulations, it may be necessary to list course names if there are no available course numbers.

If a set is complex, explanations should be included. Keep in mind that UNI accepts a maximum of 65 hours of transfer credit from community colleges and two-year institutions.
